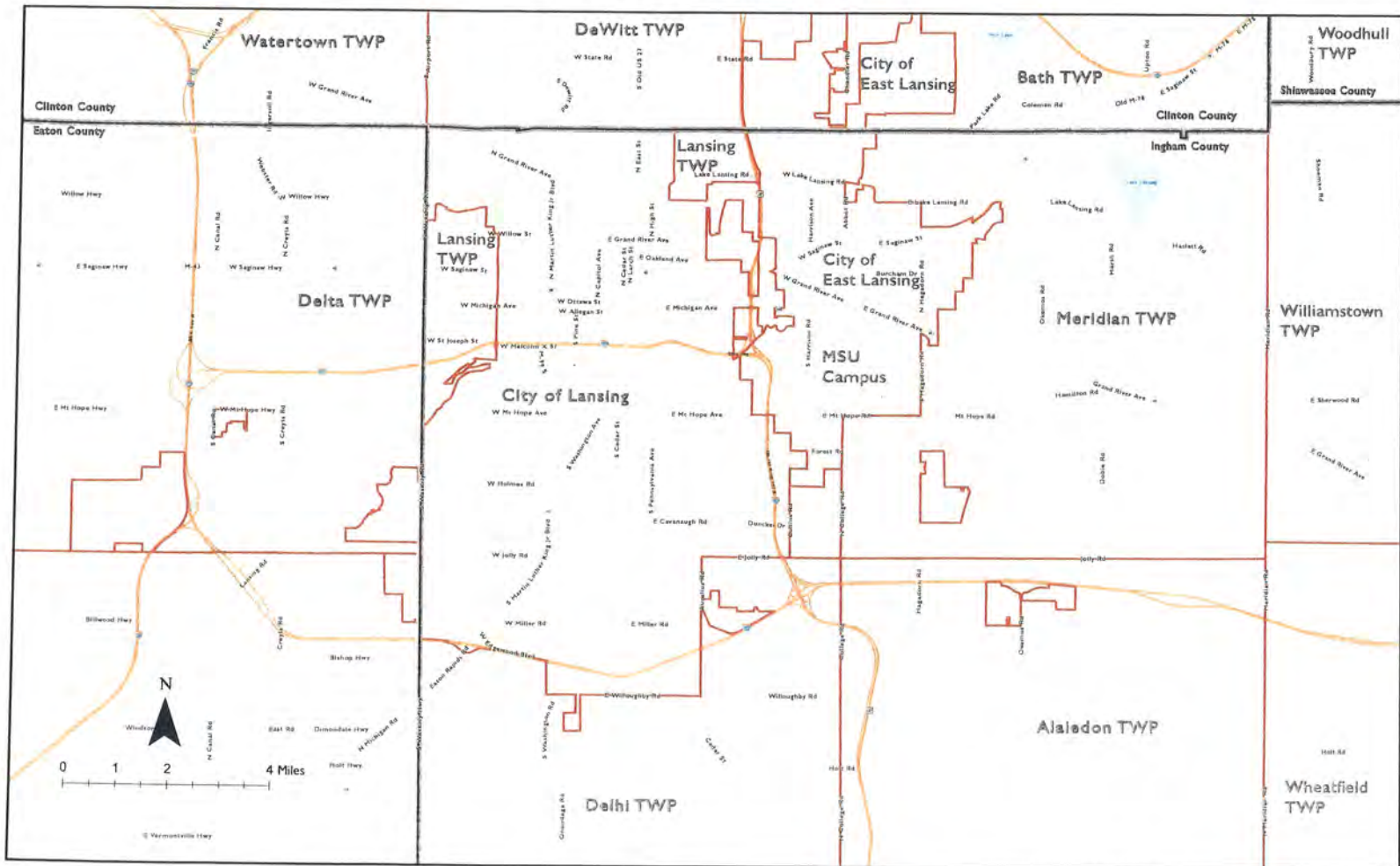
## General Overview

- Data is 2<sup>nd</sup> in 5-year collection plan
- Use November data (current maps are from 2016)
- Cannot draw trends yet, but data can help inform regional conversations
- Helps raise some questions we as a region should be asking

- Total MSU students for Fall 2016 = 50,880
- 16,455 (32%) live on campus
- 34,425 (68%) live off campus or away from region
- Note that several thousand do not live in area

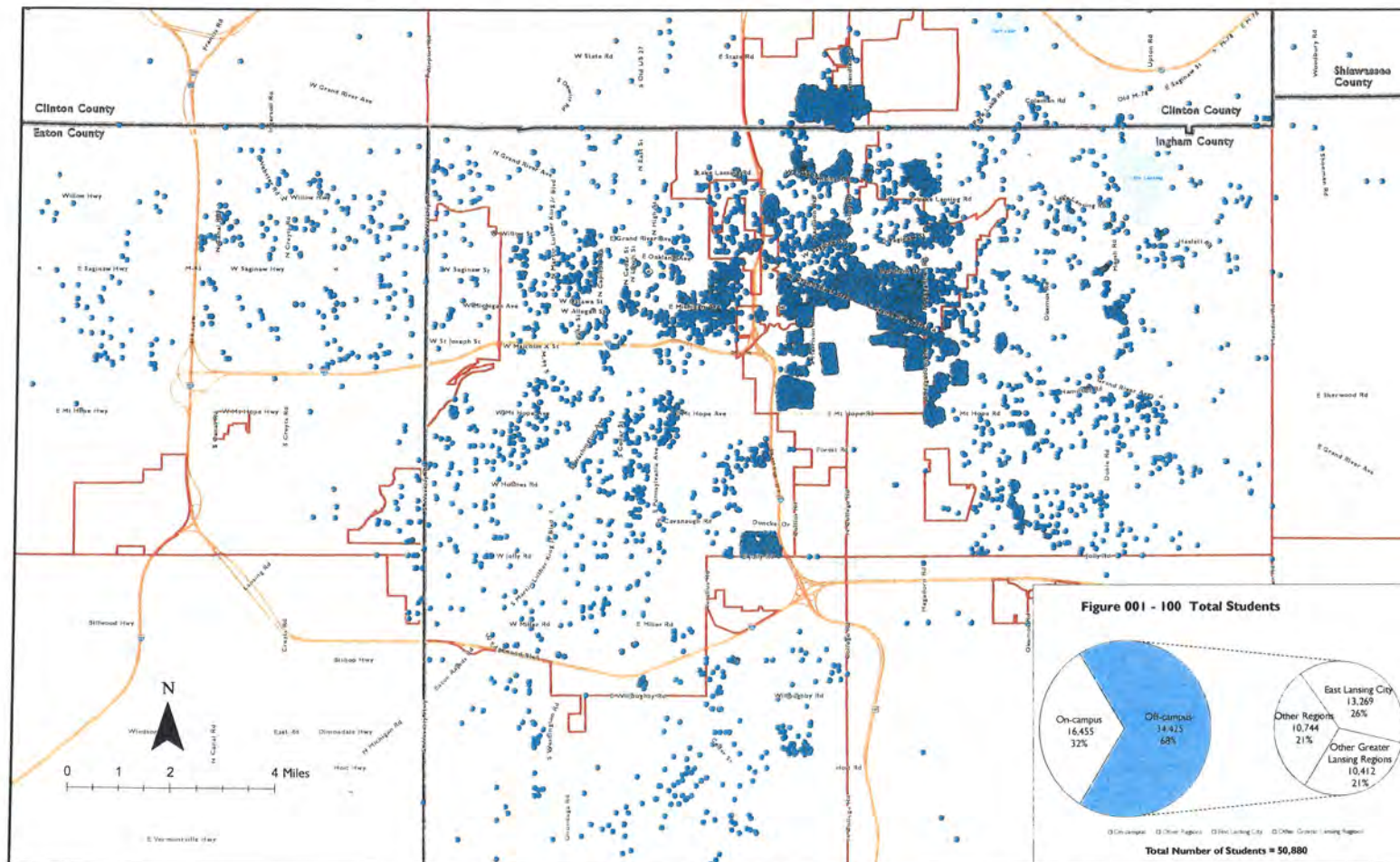
# General Bird-eye's View of Region

The Distribution of Total MSU Students in Greater Lansing Area (2016)

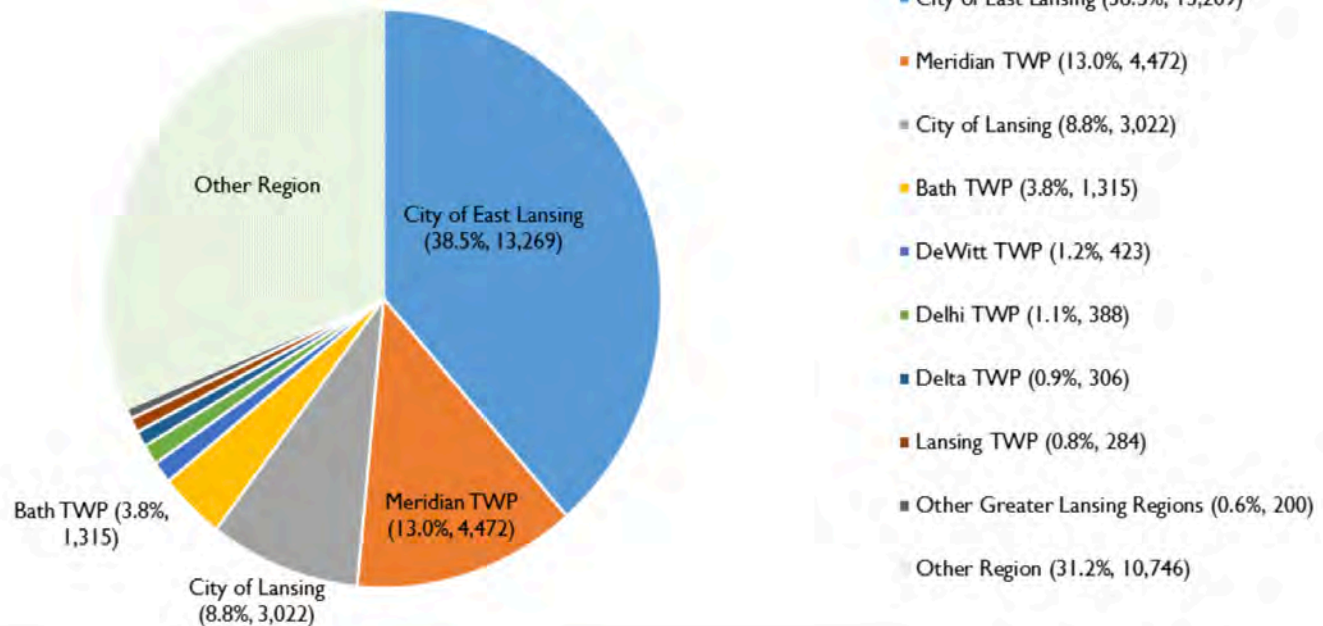

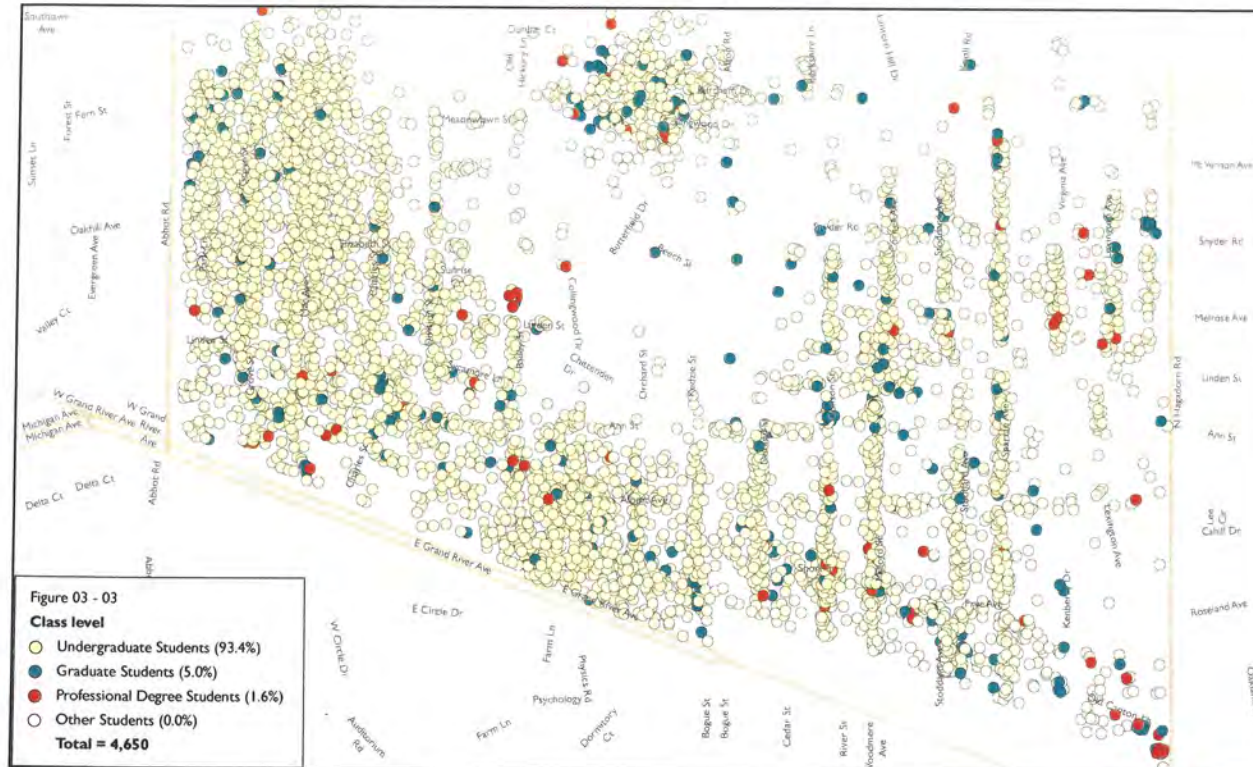

2016 MSU Students - Bailey Neighborhood



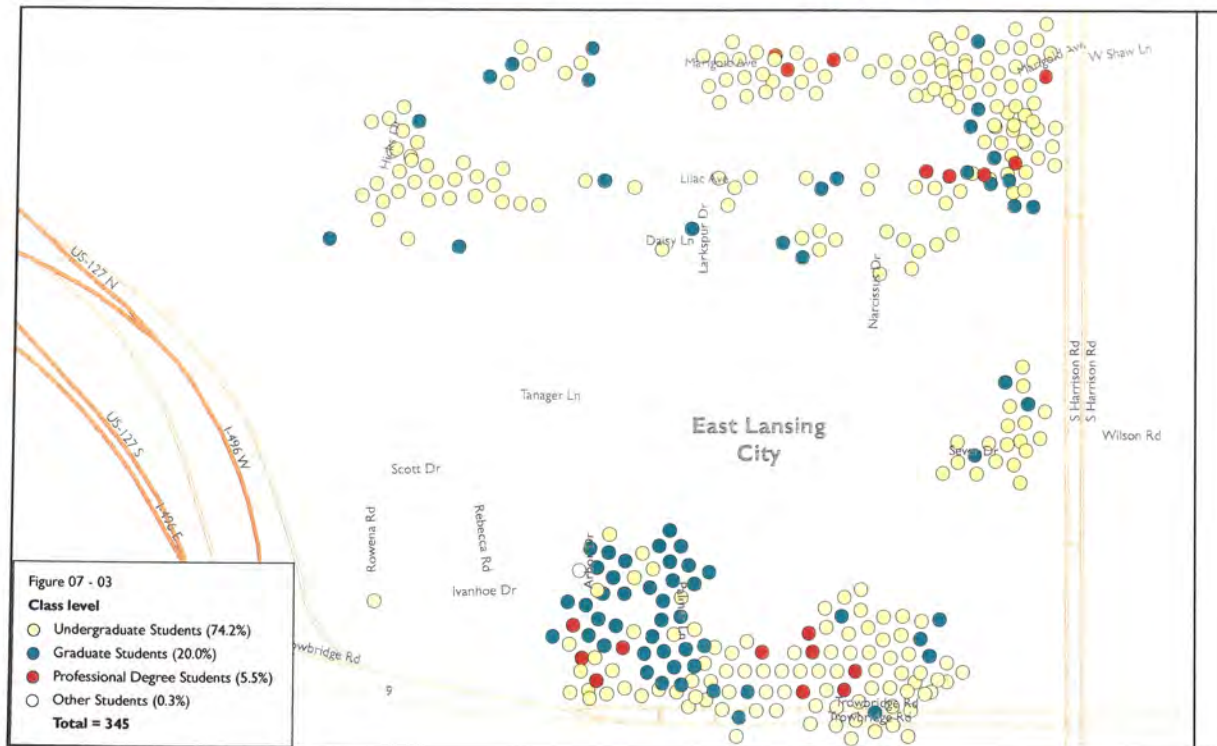

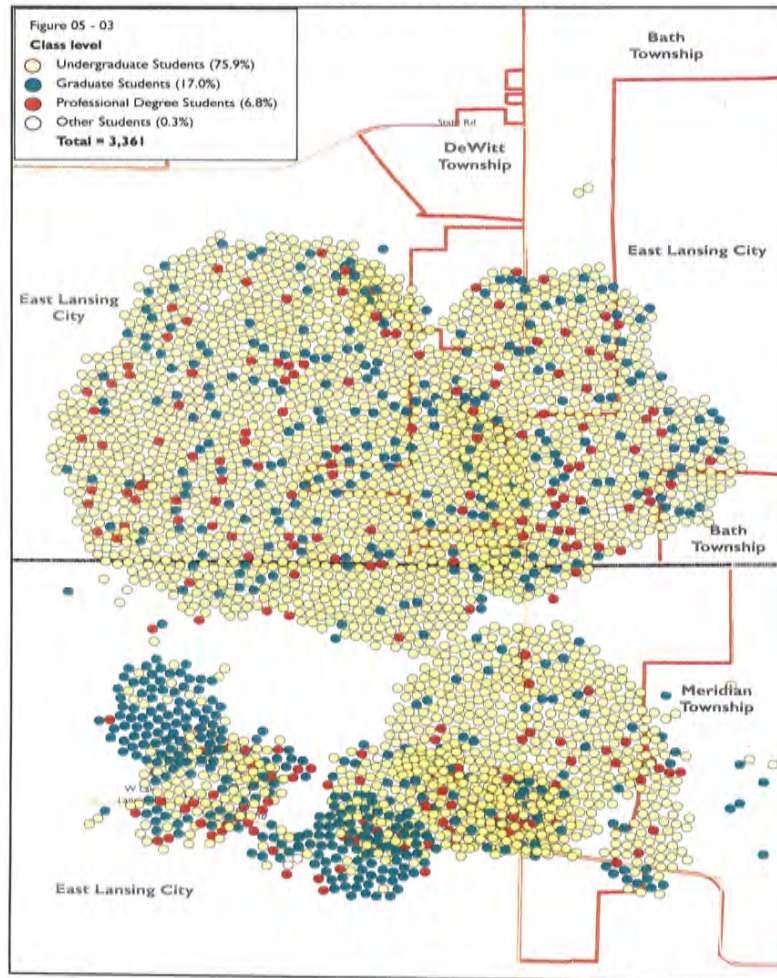

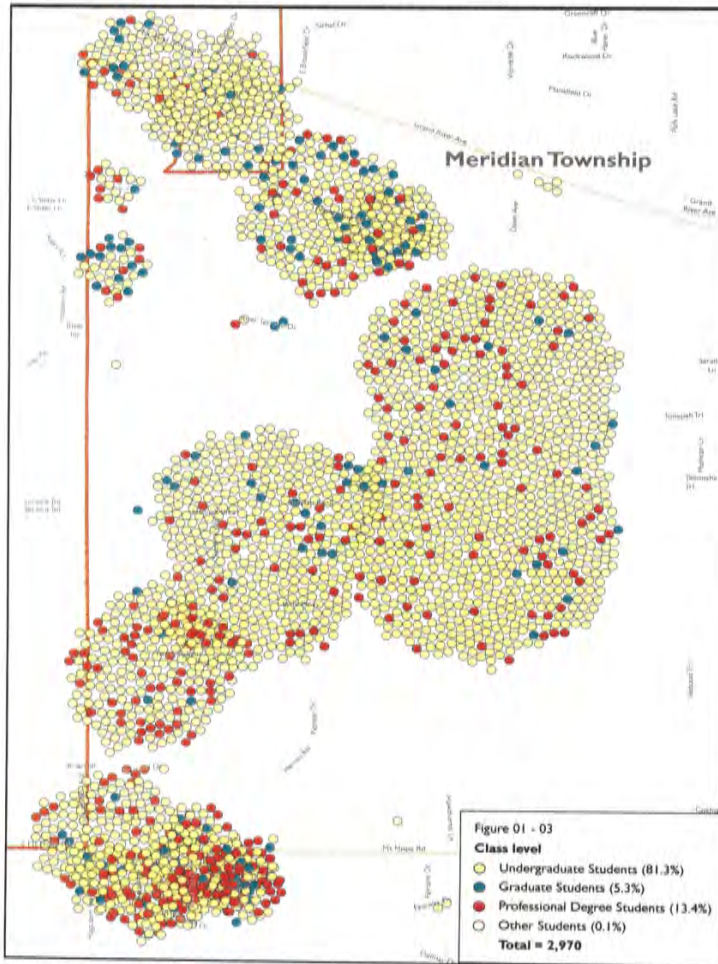

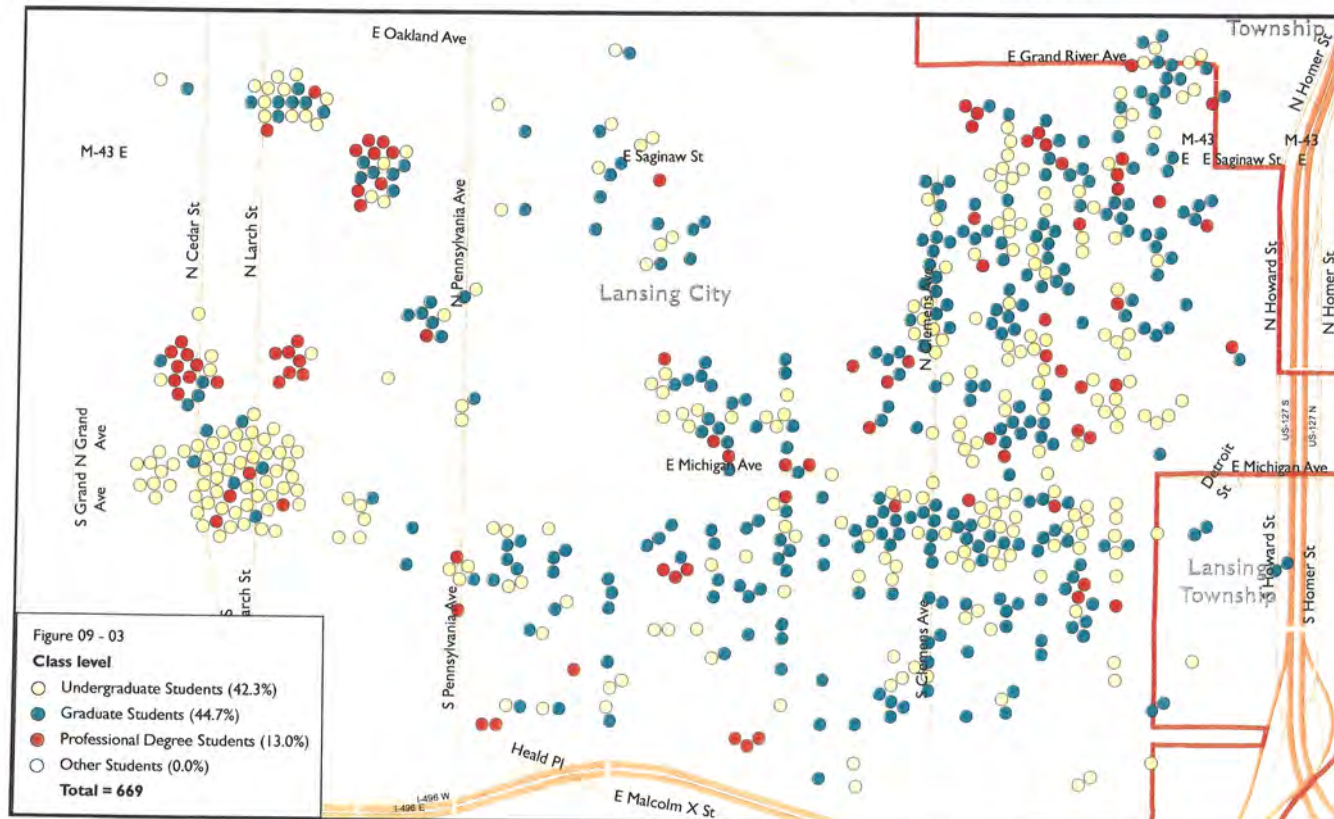

## 2016 MSU Students - Lansing (East) Neighborhood



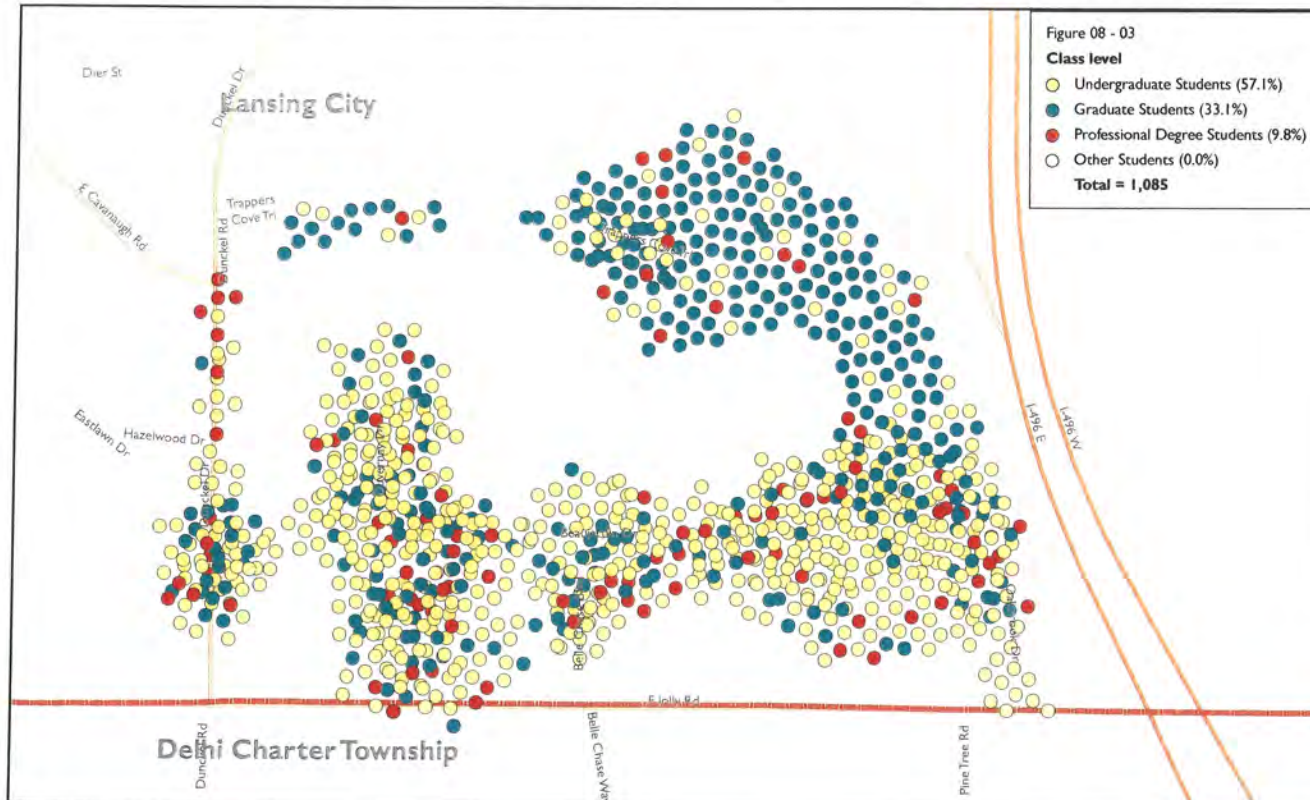
